VET 109 Applied Companion Animal Behavior - 3 Credits

Taught by Jennie K. Willis, Ph.D., Applied Animal Behaviorist, CSU Consultant

This online course explores the topic of companion animal behavior through: critical reviews of behavioral literature and its implications for applied techniques in behavior, demonstrations of applied techniques for modifying animal behavior and the application of the principles of companion animal body posture and communication to everyday treatment of animals. The course focuses on treatment of animals in veterinary practice, including improving handling techniques and safety.

Prerequisite: High School Biology, BIO 105 or equivalent

Two sections - Certified Veterinary Technicians and Veterinary Technician students
General public – continuing education

VET 242 Veterinary Critical Care - 2 Credits

Taught by Katie Doyon, CVT, VTS (ECC)

This course introduces the technical skills, knowledge and critical thinking skills required to succeed in a professional veterinary emergency/critical care facility or general practice setting which focuses on excellent nursing care. The course will focus on CPR, cardiovascular, respiratory, metabolic and endocrine emergencies. The newest techniques, skills and treatments will be offered to students, with the emphasis on mastery of an in-depth knowledge and full understanding of nursing care skills and patient care management.

Prerequisite: Enrollment in or graduate of an accredited Veterinary Technology Program.
